High Desert Park Play Area – A dedication for the new play area in High Desert Park was held on April 28. Come check out the improvements! Some have questioned the use of wood chips in the area, but Councilor Trudy Jones' office told us: "Our product is inherently fire resistant in comparison to unprocessed wood chips. But they aren't fireproof. We've had playground arson situations that were extremely high heat but the burn on the wood chip was only on the surface." *Piñon Tree Spraying* – Yellowstone Landscape will be spraying trees to control an outbreak of Piñon Needle Scale. They will be using Safari 20sg insecticide, and areas will be identified before treatment. Children and pets must be kept away from sprayed areas until the spray has dried, about 1-2 hours. Road Racing - Numerous reports have been received about speeding in our neighborhoods and vehicles running stop signs. Please remember that we have an active walking community in High Desert and consider their safety when you are driving.

Free Green Waste Pickup - Albuquerque will pick up residential Green Waste (leaves, grass, and brush) at no additional charge from Monday, May 2 through Friday, May 13. Bag your Green Waste in trash bags and have it at the curb by 7 a.m. on your regular trash collection day. All Green Waste must be placed 5 feet from automated trash and recycling containers. Each trash bag must weigh less than 40 pounds. Any branches must be cut to four-foot lengths and bundled securely. More details <u>here</u>.
