- Tumbleweed Fire Risk These small invasive plants have been enjoying the rain and are poised to produce a bumper crop of pesky weeds. The explosive growth will be in our beloved arroyos particularly. Fortunately, they are easily removed and tossed into the trash pickup can -- better now when they are green than when they are larger and difficult to handle.
- Goats Love Tumbleweeds Goatscaping season is upon us. Last year 30 families in the Estate/Premier villages brought in goats. Once a year in the Fall is recommended, so we encourage you to get on the schedule of the service commonly used in High Desert, Horned Locust Goatscaping. Text Amanita at 505-470-8741.

New Voting Members Elected – 13 of the 25 High Desert villages conducted elections for Voting Members this summer. Congratulations to the 16 returning Voting Members and Alternates as well as the 8 newly elected Voting Members and Alternates. Unfortunately, there were no volunteers for Chaco Compound, so the Village will not be represented on association matters.

Dead Trees being Removed – A new survey of dead trees throughout all High Desert common areas has recently been completed. Yellowstone will begin the removal of dead trees in High Desert common areas in late October. Over 85 trees have been identified and a proposal to remove all the dead trees has been developed. The first group to be removed: Trees in Pino Pond. The second group to be removed: Trees along Tramway. The third group to be removed: Trees along the streetscape. After these trees are removed the Bulletin will list the locations of other trees.

Political Canvassing – Election season is upon us. Please be aware that Albuquerque's ordinance that prohibits business solicitation without a permit does not apply to political canvassing. You can, however, ask a canvasser to leave your property, and they are required to comply.
