General Announcements:

It's Official!! — All three proposed amendments to the High Desert By-Laws received Written Consent by an overwhelming majority of Voting Members. For Proposal 1 (Change Nominating Committee Chair from Board Member to Voting Member and add responsibility to oversee Voting Member elections), 87% of the weighted votes were in favor. For Proposal 2 (Allow Board to fill vacant Voting Member positions instead of requiring special elections), 91% of the weighted votes were in favor. For Proposal 3 (Extend voting options so Voting Members can also vote by absentee ballot or electronic methods), 80% of the weighted votes were in favor. After the document recording is completed, the revised By-Laws will be posted on our website.

Congratulations to the 23 newly elected Voting Members! – For a two-year term, these Voting Members will be representing their respective villages: The Canyons, Chaco Ridge, Desert Highlands, Desert Mountain, Desert Sky, Trailhead, Mountain Highlands, Trillium, West Highlands, Wilderness Canon, The Aerie, and Highlands. The Voting Members for all villages are listed on the High Desert website.

Expect More Traffic Sunday – An event is being held at the Elena Gallegos picnic area on Sunday, October 1, which will likely increase traffic along Simms Park Road. There will also likely be more activity on the nearby hiking trails.

On-Call Expertise Needed – High Desert needs homeowners with expertise to advise the Board and committees on matters such as finance, engineering, hydrology, landscaping, communications, and more. Progress on Evaluating Trees – The Board, Landscape Committee and Natural Resources Committee met with Legacy Tree Company on August 25th for a kick-off meeting regarding the review, assessment, and long-term planning for the failing pinon pine trees throughout the community. Since then, Legacy has completed irrigation evaluations, with the help of Yellowstone, to understand the irrigation going to the pinon trees and to assess deficiencies in the system. Legacy Tree is also evaluating the pinon trees in the main thoroughfares, currently including Cortaderia, Imperata, Spain, Academy, and Blue Gramma. Trees in these areas have the highest visibility impact on owners and visitors in High Desert. As Legacy Tree completes its evaluations, it will bring long-term planning strategies and ideas for improving irrigation to the pinons, root structure and plant healthcare treatments, and even removals and replacements. As we learn more details about their assessments, these will be shared with the community. Also, the Landscape Committee is inventorying the dead trees for removal.

New APD App – The Albuquerque Police Department has a new app called Atlas One that has replaced APD's old app (which no longer functions or sends APD information). If you're interested in using Atlas One, there's information on <u>APD's website</u> as well as a <u>YouTube guide</u>.
